*"The Receiving State should not postpone processing a juvenile's referral packet pending the missing signatures."*

#### **Topic: Form IA/VI**

The Form IA/VI: Application for Services and Waiver is used when a juvenile is placed or moves out of state and supervision is requested. The Form IA/VI is to be signed by the juvenile, the placement resource and the Sending State Judge or Compact Official.

When a juvenile relocates to the Receiving State prior to signing the Form IA/VI, or the Sending State Judge refuses to sign the Form until the juvenile and the placement resource have signed, the Sending State shall forward the Form to the Receiving State asking that the necessary signatures be obtained. The Receiving State then returns the signed Form to the Sending State for any additional signatures.

When all the appropriate signatures are obtained, the Sending State shall furnish a copy of the completed Form IA/VI to the Receiving State. The Receiving State should not postpone processing a juvenile's referral packet pending the missing signatures. This process will avoid any delay in providing services to the juvenile.
