Managing Quarterly Progress Reports

The Pending Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) Detail Report shows impending due dates for active transfer files. States can use this report to manage QPR due dates and ensure compliance with the reporting requirements in Rule 5-101.

For active transfer files with a document present under the Form IX divider, this report will provide four upcoming QPR due dates. States are able to sort results by the sending or receiving state.

Dates in red indicate overdue QPRs

The QPR due dates displayed on the report are 90, 180, 270, and 360 calendar days from the date the receiving state clicks the “Juvenile Transfer Complete” icon in the Request for Transfer of Supervision workflow.

If the receiving state sends a QPR via the Quarterly Progress Report workflow, the due dates adjust based on the date the receiving sent the most recent QPR. The next four QPR due dates will be 90, 180, 270, and 360 days from this date.

If a file has an overdue QPR, contact your field officer to obtain an updated report and send it to the sending state via the Quarterly Progress Report workflow. The report will automatically adjust the pending QPR due dates.

Please note, if the receiving state sends a Form IX via the Violation Report and Reply or Absconder Under ICJ Supervision workflow, the report will not adjust the QPR due dates. The report only uses the Quarterly Progress Report workflow to determine QPR due dates.
